What a term!! Life at Leeds Faith in Schools is always busy, but it would be fair to say this past term has been busier than ever. In the last couple of months we've taught 88 classes across 5 schools about the gift of God's grace at Easter, we've facilitated a week of creative prayer experiences for years 7 & 8, gathered our supporters to celebrate another year of serving the schools and churches of Leeds, taken part in 'grill a Christian' lessons, local authority syllabus planning, assisted with a Christ-centred residential for 30 students, led over 30 assemblies bringing Christian perspectives to various topics and all this while continuing to mentor nearly 90 young people on a weekly basis, supporting a further 60+ weekly through boys and girls groups, plus supporting 3 after school drop-in clubs and weekly lunch clubs in 7 of our schools. Phew!

At the heart of each and every one of the activities listed above are young people, thousands of them, individuals precious to the heart of God. As we work to make known to them the Good News of the Gospel through word and deed, I'm struck by the immense blessing of God's continual provision through opportunity. As opportunities continues to grow we now, more than ever, need your help to reach this next generation with hope, love and the compassion of God.

As always, the coming pages are packed with the stories behind these brilliant opportunities and the work of our fantastic team. Thank you for your ongoing support of our work and I trust you will be encouraged by another term of being 'Good News' to the high schools of Leeds.

## NEW BEGINNINGS



#### LEEDS CITY ACADEMY

In the final weeks before Easter, we had the privilege of visiting Leeds City Academy as part of their year 7 faith day. Having historically had weekly work in the school, it was great to make a return and we hope the beginning of a new opportunity to engage with this school's brilliant young people. Our visit was supported by two local churches who joined us for the day's sessions. We hope that this is the beginning of a partnership that can impact this community in a new way. Good News UK also supported our visit by providing 50 New Testaments to give away invitationally to the classes we met. The desire for these was so great we ran out of Bibles part way through the day, with students tracking us down during break time to make sure their friends got a copy. With desire from the school for a lunchtime Christian Union group we hope this is the start of an exciting new start here. #### **GARFORTH DEVELOPMENTS**

In the past few weeks there have been new projects starting in Garforth that we are really thrilled about and have been in the works for a while. Firstly, a year 7 girls group. The aim of this group is to help with the transition of joining a new school, by encouraging friendships and teaching important skills and topics that will help them in their teenage years.

We are very excited about the second project because it is student led. We were approached by a year 10 student who was very keen to start a Christian Union for himself, his friends and others in his year. The idea is to create a space for existing Christians to talk about their faith, and room for potential new Christians to learn about the Christian faith. The student will be leading Bible studies every week, with the support of LFIS.

#### RALPH THORESBY

After much prayer, it is my pleasure to report that we have made a really positive start, working at Ralph Thoresby School. Mark has been leading a boys group, while Kim, with Lori - the youth worker from St Paul's Church, Ireland Wood - has been leading her fourth(!) 'I'm the Girl' course.

We would like to thank everyone who prayed for us to establish links with the school. We would love your ongoing prayers for our school connections and knowing how to best bless the local community, alongside the great work St Paul's are already doing.







#### WHAT IS GRACE?

This year we made grace our focus in our Easter lessons. It was fantastic to be able to explain the gospel of grace multiple times in one lesson: through games, presentations, storytelling, and our own testimonies. We had great fun telling the Easter story with props, which included the usual things you would expect, like palm leaves and nails, but also had some curveballs like a rubber ear!

We have had lots of great feedback from students and teachers about this year's lesson. Students have enjoyed the games and the competitive elements while staff like that it fits in so closely with their curriculum.



#### ABBEY GRANGE PRAYER SPACES

Once again, Year 7 and 8 students from Abbey Grange were invited to engage in prayer spaces at Abbey Grange. It has become a staple in their school year, offering diverse ways to connect with their faith. Students have 50 minutes to visit various stations offering them different ways to engage with prayer. From praying for the worldwide persecuted church to posting 'letters to God' as a way of praying for their respective local communities, the students engaged with the 13 different stations.

One particularly thought-provoking station encouraged them to reflect on the 'masks' they wear in their daily lives – a metaphor for the personas we adopt. This led to some insightful discussions about authenticity and acceptance amongst peers.

It was a moment of pause amid the busyness of school life, allowing them to connect with something deeper and some of their contributions blew us away.

If you don't already regularly support our work then please consider if you could do so. And if you already give to LFIS could you consider increasing your gift to support us in this season?


